GENERAL INFORMATION

Divine Mercy Parish offers our parish family a safe and welcoming environment at our St. Joseph site for the Religious Education program of our community. Our catechists and volunteers value creativity, flexibility and fun in our Religious Education program so children, youth and adults will be engaged in and remember the important lessons of our Catholic faith. In each lesson, we strive to open hearts to the Love of God while helping those who come to learn and have confidence in sharing the joy of our faith.

This year's schedule will be a bit different because we continue to update and evolve our programs to better serve our families and our community. General session times and options for coming year are later in this booklet. The detailed calendar with a complete list of session dates is available here and online. If you are interested in volunteering for this year's program, please see insert and contact the Director of Mission or the Coordinator of Child and Youth Ministry for more information. And always, *Please pray for our catechists, all volunteers and staff as we guide and support the Religious Education ministries of Divine Mercy Parish.*

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

The Sacraments are the most important part of our Catholic Identity. The goal of our catechesis (Religious Education) is to guide everyone of all ages to a more conscious and active participation in Eucharist and to a fuller appreciation of the Baptismal call to discipleship. Together, we transform each other and, in turn, we transform the world into the Kingdom of God. Regular participation in Sunday liturgy is a crucial part of the Religious Education of every Catholic and especially those in preparation for the Sacraments.

Baptism

We are always so happy when parents bring their children to the Church for Baptism. If your child is ready to enter our Religious Education program and has not been baptized, please contact Margie Meyers, Director of Mission as soon as possible. Readiness happens at different times for different children and families. We welcome families and children of all ages in our Baptism prep.

Adults typically prepare for Baptism and/or Confirmation through a process called the RCIA or Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. If you have questions about how to enter this process, please contact the Director of Mission, Margie Meyers at margaret.meyers@archbalt.org or call (301) 687-6767.

Reconciliation and Eucharist

Typically, children celebrate the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Communion in their 2nd grade year. All children older than 2nd grade are welcome into the process if they have not yet experienced either Sacrament for the first time. Participation in a formal program of Religious Education in a parish program or Catholic school is required for a full year before Sacramental Prep begins. This means a child must be enrolled in our parish program or Bishop Walsh for First Grade to prepare for First Eucharist in Grade 2. Children can enroll in our program at anytime. Don't let a late start hold you back! The year of preparation for these two important Sacraments is an exciting and rewarding time for most families. Our program includes parent and family involvement in the home and in parish events along with regular and consistent Mass attendance. Please note that our first meeting for Reconciliation & Communion Preparation will be Oct. 18, 2022 (Tuesday) ,6:30 pm. Joseph Parish Hall. If your child was baptized a church outside of our Divine Mercy Parish, please send a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate to the parish when preparation begins.

Confirmation

As Catholics, we know that Confirmation is **not** a graduation from faith, but, rather a renewed beginning to continue to live and learn how to be an active participant in the life of Christ, Our Lord. At Divine Mercy Parish, Confirmation is celebrated every two years for students in 9th grade and older. Preparation for the sacrament begins at Baptism and accelerates in 8th Grade. Our next celebration of Confirmation will be in 2023, and students who are the 9th grade or older for the 2022 school year, will participate in the preparation process this year, which includes actively participating in Religious Education either in the Parish Program or as a student at Bishop Walsh. Sessions are scheduled for this year's 9th and 10th graders and older youth (see schedule later in this booklet). A Parent and Student meeting was held in Apr. 2022, and will be repeated as a ZOOM session on Sunday, Sept. 18, (See bulletin for exact time) with parents and teens who missed. Confirmation candidates are required to participate in Religious Education for two full years before the celebration of the Sacrament. Confirmation candidates are also required to complete 15 hours of community service and the service hours can be done in the 2 years prior to Confirmation.

FOR FAMILIES INCLUDING CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

We believe the Children and Youth of Divine Mercy who have Special Needs are very important to our parish family here. We welcome all students into the Religious Education and Sacramental Preparation programs and will work with parents to discern the best placement and method for each individual. If you are interested in registering your child or becoming involved, please contact the Director of Mission, Margie Meyers, as soon as possible. Everyone is welcome in all of our education events and programs and we will do our best to find the right path for each member of our church family to experience God's love in their own lives.

FOR FAMILIES OF BISHOP WALSH STUDENTS



The parish is an important part of the faith development of every child, youth and adult. We at Divine Mercy are happy to work in partnership with our Bishop Walsh Families in hopes that our BW students will have a rich and balanced faith, steeped in liturgical connection and discipleship. We want all

of our children and youth to feel a sense of belonging and connection to their home parish. This sense of connection often takes a very intentional effort on the part of the parish and the Catholic School student's family. Of course, most important is the family's regular participation in Sunday liturgy at the parish. We encourage students to be involved in liturgy as much as possible. The ministry of altar serving is open to children in Grade 4 and older (and adults).

Because of the liturgical nature of our Sacraments, the connection to home parish is especially critical during the time of preparation for Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation. Both Bishop Walsh School and Divine Mercy Parish follow the policy of the Archdiocese of Baltimore that states that the immediate preparation for any Catholic Sacrament is parish-based. Following the policy of the Archdiocese, all Bishop Walsh students who are preparing for Sacraments such as Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation are expected to participate in all of the parish-based Sacramental preparation process, which will include meetings and info sessions for parents, home preparation, separate workshops or retreats. We try to notify all families by email but that process is not completely dependable. Please watch the schedule in this booklet and regular announcements in the Parish Bulletin and on the Divine Mercy Religious Education webpage.

If your child is in 2nd Grade this year and will be preparing for Reconciliation and Eucharist, please email the RE Coordinator, Sara Vance, by Sept. 30, 2022, to make sure your family's current email and phone information are on our Sacramental Preparation list. See schedule for dates important for preparation for First Communion and First Reconciliation.

Bishop Walsh Students who are members of Divine Mercy <u>are always welcome</u> at any Religious Education event or program. While the Religious classes at BW do fulfill requirements of faith education, *being involved with peers in the home parish is an important part of being Catholic.* We are excited about our programs for Middle and High School youth and hope BW students will participate. We suggest parents watch the bulletin and encourage youth participation in our Christmas Program (Dec. 18 at the Midland Fire Hall), and youth retreats, field trips and service projects that could be scheduled during the year.

TUITION AND FEES

Tuition for Religious Education is \$40 for one child and \$10 for each sibling. There is a \$5 discount for early registration, by Sept. 18. For sacramental preparation, First Reconciliation and First Eucharist, there is a fee of \$35 in addition to Religious Education tuition. Please include tuition and fees when your registration (by form or online). If the cost of Religious Education causes financial hardship for any family, scholarships, fee waivers, and partial payment plans are readily available. Please contact Sara Vance to make arrangements. While all fees do help support our program, we are committed to the policy that no student should be kept from Religious Education because of problems with cost. This year, students who are living with grandparents or other relatives because of family difficulty or hardship, will receive **automatic scholarships.** Just check the appropriate box on the registration form. There may be occasional fees requests for events such as activities, retreats or field trips which can be waived on request of the family.

FAMILY BASED RELIGIOUS EDUCATION!

Family faith interaction is important for children of every age, and this year, we continue strengthening the family component of for Pre-K through Grade 6 which will be family based or family centered. This year, planned parent involvement continues to be an important component of Faith Formation. Each month, home based sessions help encourage healthy faith discussions in the family which are crucial to faith formation in children and youth. These sessions will help strengthen the parents in their role as primary catechists of their children. Practically, these home based sessions allow us to cover more of our Faith Story without adding extra sessions and allowing for flexibility in the busy schedules of our families.

Regular contact between **catechists and parents is** very important. **Please make sure your contact information is always up-to-date with the Parish Office and the catechist(s) of your child/children.** Schedules are included in this booklet, but plans are incomplete for all events during the year and dates may change. Please remember to watch the parish bulletin for up-to-date information and keep in contact with the Catechist who is leading your child's class.

ELEMENTARY RELIGIOUS EDUCATION—PreK through Grade 8

2 Sunday mornings each month (See schedule for dates) from 10:00 – 11:30am
Children are in graded sessions with their peers and a vatechist and aide for two Sundays each month.
Parent(s) must attend one separate adult session on the 1st Sunday of each month. Parents are
INVITED to participate in a special adult session held on the 3rd Sunday of each month. See more
information later in this booklet. Parents are asked to complete two home lessons with children
during the weeks when no required sessions meet.

On the 3rd Sunday of each month, the 9:00 Mass will be a Family Mass. Children and parents are invited to participate in the ministries of the mass. Please encourage your children to volunteer.

YOUTH MINISTRY—Grades 9—12

Senior High (Grades 9 and up)

SENIOR HIGH (Grades 9-12) - Various Locations

Our High School program has been completely revised to feel more like a Youth Ministry program and less like school. We hope our teens will enjoy the sessions, build positive peer and adult relationships and find the themes relevant to their lives. Our teenagers need opportunities to explore and question, while looking ahead at how our Catholic Faith can help us be our best selves. We hope our program will give our teens a solid foundation in love and faith that will ground them as faithful, happy and productive adults who will make a positive difference in the world.

These sessions meet separately from the Sunday morning program at St Joseph's, usually on Sunday afternoons. Parents are needed to help support the program. Providing snacks for each session is a great way to help. Occasional off-campus activities and service projects will require transportation and additional supervision help. Each separate session requires an adult helper in addition to the Catechist. All parents are encouraged to keep their VIRTUS Clearance up to date.

PARTICIPATION IN MASS

Mass is not optional for Catholics. It is the source and summit of our faith. Mass is our time to be thankful for the gifts bestowed on us by God and share in worship with a community that is connected in faith and love. The Sunday program is designed so children may participate at Mass with their family at St. Joseph's or attend the Noon Mass at St. Michael's. Saturday evening Masses at both St. Michael and St. Peter are also good options. Students and Families are welcome to participate in Mass anywhere, but we ask that you plan your schedules to allow students to be on time for the start of the session. (no later than 10:00 am) Since the official program only meets twice per month, families may attend any liturgy at any of our churches on the off-weeks.


